(Fort Worth) – Tevin Wilson has been found guilty by a Tarrant County jury of Capital Murder, Arson and Tampering with Evidence. He was sentenced by Judge Scott Wisch to Life without the possibility of parole, in addition to 2 terms of 10 years in prison.

Wilson was on trial for the 2015 murder of Fort Worth resident Kendal Craddock. He and an accomplice were charged with going to Craddock's home with the intent of robbing him of money and drugs, then shooting him in the head, stealing his car and later abandoning it and setting it on fire.

"This case is a tragic example of the loss of life and destruction of families that goes along with dealing drugs," said lead prosecutor, Lisa Callaghan. "By aggressively prosecuting these cases, we are making it clear we won't accept the victimization of families or entire neighborhoods through engaging in this conduct all for the sole purpose of greed."

The case against Wilson's co-defendant, Willie D. Harris, is pending.
