Teen who killed Uber Eats driver in 2021 sentenced to 45 years in prison

(Fort Worth, TX) – On Thursday, Zak Marshall, 17, pled guilty and was sentenced to 45 years in prison for the 2021 murder of Ryan Munsie Graham, a mother of three who was out making food deliveries for Uber Eats.

On January 23, 2021, Graham, 31, was delivering food to a Haltom City apartment complex. Marshall fatally stabbed her in the neck and left her unresponsive, in a pool of blood.

Marshall and an accomplice were arrested for her murder. They said they wanted to steal Graham's car, but they couldn't find the keys.

"This was a brutal, senseless murder," Assistant Criminal District Attorney Rose Anna Salinas said.

Marshall, who was 14 at the time of the murder, was certified as an adult. His accomplice, a juvenile, pled guilty last year and was sentenced to seven years in the Texas Juvenile Justice Department for aggravated robbery.

During the sentencing hearing today, Graham's stepmother, Donna Munsie, spoke via Zoom.

She said she struggles daily with explaining to her grandchildren that their mother is never coming back. She held up a picture of Graham to show the defendant.

"Ryan did not deserve to have her life taken," she said. "She had such a good heart. Her laughter was infectious. We think about her every day."

Marshall said: "I am sorry for what I've done and I think about it a lot. ... I'm sorry she was the one who had to experience my anger for things that had nothing to do with her."

Graham's mother, Suzanne Munsie, then spoke.

She said Ryan, who loved being a mother, will never have the joy of being a grandmother.

"I don't want to hear about anger," she said. "You made a choice to go out to try to steal a car. You made a choice ... to stab her in the neck with a knife. Who does that?"

"You've destroyed everything. ... I'm glad they gave you 45 years."
