Greater Fort Worth had a large turnout with more than 25 athletes in attendance. The Fort Worth Boat Club hosted the first Special Olympics

Texas Sailboat Regatta on Aug. 29, 1998. Twenty-six members volunteered their sailboats for the event which carried athletes, family and spectators. The skippers of each boat worked with each athlete to identify skills and tasks that Special Olympians could accomplish. Many athletes got the opportunity to be temporary skippers while others were busy pulling in the sheets on the tack. Then the athletes were given the chance to put their skills to the test. A regatta was designed to give athletes the experience of

competing in a sailboat race. The four-mile race consisted of two buoys that had to be rounded before reaching the finish line. After the competition, dinner was provided and the Shriner Clowns came to hand out trophies and t-shirts to each ath-

Area Director Michael Heaslet said the experience was so successful that the Fort Worth Boat Club has agreed to make this an annual event.

Future sailors in Central Texas joined Austin Yacht Club members at the club on Oct. 24, 1998. The morning began with an introduction to sailing from Gretchen Hanover, AYC Member. Hanover, Special Olympics Texas Sailing Sport Director, showed her skills as she taught participants the safety rules, risk factors, wind patterns, sailing terminology and other sailing necessities. Area Director Joy Blair said it was an opportunity to learn to act as a team by listening and being aware on the boat. Role playing helped participants learn all the aspects of the sport. When they made it back to land, everyone enjoyed a barbecue lunch cooked by SOTX staff members.

Although the turnout was lower than expected, Blair said it was a good experience and it was an opportunity to see who would be interested in

Both areas agreed that these events were positive and have given athletes the opportunity to learn a new sport. With events like these, SOTX hopes to develop its own Unified Sailing Program and send members to the 1999 World Games in North Carolina.

SPECIAL OLYMPICS TO BENEFIT ATHLETES ALONG THE BORDER

hrough new outreach efforts, the Special will soon provide athletic training and competition for people who live in seven border towns located in West Texas. The expansion of their services will benefit more than 50 people with mental retardation in the remote cities of Presidio, Alpine, Marfa, Van Horn, Fort Davis, Valentine and Marathon.

"Currently there is nothing for people with mental retardation in this area and if we do not do something about this it will remain that way," said Domingo Vargas, a volunteer who is organizing most of the activities.

A Coaches Training School has been sched-Olympics Texas Permian Basin-Big Bend area uled for volunteers in the Presidio area, December 19. Organizers from the Special Olympics program in Ojinaga, Mexico, Presidio's next door neighbor, will join forces with volunteers like Vargas and assist with some of the activities.

There are also plans to invite athletes from Ojinaga to a tentative competition which will be held in Presidio sometime in March. The Permian Basin-Big Bend area will offer athletics and soccer at the initial competition and plans to add aquatics and cycling depending on the interest of the Special Olympians.

hen the exuberant young athlete, who came in last, lifted her small trophy high in the air and shouted, "I did it! I did it!," there could be no doubt that the Texas Special Olympics Regatta is well worth the effort.

But, every day?

Athletes were registering for the Special Olympics sailing competition at the Fort Worth Boat Club recently when a 16year-old boy named Boomer approached Bip Nauta, fixing her

with an intense stare and pointing his finger in her face.

"Can-we-do-this-every-day?" he asked seriously, pronouncing each word distinctly and jabbing his finger at her for emphasis.

"Well, not every day, but we can do it every year. Will you come back next year?" she asked.

Boomer grinned and nodded yes. Like all 26 competitors, he went home a winner — clutching a trophy in one hand and his Special Olympics cap in the other and looking forward to next year.

Nauta is responsible not only for the idea of adding sailing to the Texas Special Olympics competition, but also for recruiting boats, skippers, crews and special guests, and for blowing up most of the 500 balloons that decked the docks of the Fort

Worth Boat Club along with dozens of colorful flags for the second annual event, on Sept. 11.

When she began organizing the first Texas Special Olympics Regatta two years ago, Nauta says she just thought it would be a fun way for the club to give back to the community. Now, she says she knows that the Special Olympics event has given back much more than it has taken in time and effort.

"There is just this chain of excitement. Once you get started, everybody wants to be part of it. I made a phone call to check out the possibility of us hosting a Special Olympics regatta, and within hours, I had more than enough boats and skippers and crews volunteering to help," Nauta says. "The club's excitement was overwhelming. The chain of excitement was never broken."

She organized the first Special Olympics sailing race in the summer of 1998. She has been entertainment chairman of the Fort Worth Boat Club since the day

she and her husband, Bernie, joined in 1994.

"She's fabulous," says
Michael Heaslet, Area 11 director
for the Special Olympics. "It
takes individuals willing to take
on the responsibility of organizing one of these events. We have
only three paid staff [members]
and 1,600 athletes from a 10county area that extends from
Gainesville to Stephenville.

"We offer 15 sports each year," Heaslet says. "It takes a tremendous amount of volunteer support to pull these events off. Bip is a go-getter, and she's dedicated to opening up sailing to everybody, including our athletes. It makes their lives better."

Nauta says the Special Olympics, sanctioned for athletes age 8 and over with mental retardation, are all about people like Zack, who is about 16 and told everyone, "Just call me Captain Zack from now on."

And Arthur, who, when the race started, said he was not coming out of the cabin because he was afraid of sharks, but who was at the wheel with the skipper sailing the boat when it crossed the finish line.





The boats seem to be lining up. There is a second shot - now it begins to look very much like a race. All boats are heading for

the same buoy marking the first leg of the course, which must be rounded counter-clockwise - a potential for some more wandering about to get in the right position. The wind on this leg is blowing slightly toward the boats, and they have to "beat" a bit into the wind to make their mark - a large, bright yellow inflatable buoy.

Then it's a downwind leg probably the easiest run for spectators to understand. All the boats are going in a tight line and headed for another buoy, and a "reach" for the finish line. Assuming, of course, that the wind direction and speed doesn't change much during the race.

With the steady breeze, the race was completed in about an hour. And, as most sailors will tell you, that's the time to party. and the Special Olympics Sailing Regatta was no different. Crews and Athletes enjoyed mid-afternoon cookout. Clowns, David and Donna Thomason, performed their mystifying magic tricks. The Athletes received prizes donated Joe Macko, Goodwill Ambassador of the Rangers Baseball team. And each Athlete

received a trophy - everyone is a winner in this regatta. Other sponsors included Sante' Rehabilitation, Louis Church, Larry McCracken, Robert Freedman and the Fort Worth Boat Club.


