



HIV & AIDS IN TARRANT COUNTY, 2001-2008


The rate of new HIV/AIDS cases among Blacks is more than four times higher than among Whites and Hispanics.

At the end of 2008, there were 3,802 persons in Tarrant County living with HIV/AIDS.

The greatest increase in HIV infection rate occurred among 15-24 year olds (92% increase from 2001-2008).

From 2007 to 2008, approximately 9% of all new HIV cases were co-infected with Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, or Syphilis.
